The word of the week is: "*Listening.*" I am listening and meeting daily with many, making family connections, visiting parishioners in nursing homes and assisted living centers, and attending to the joyful tasks of genuine pastoring. A priest classmate, who I've known since 1973, visited this week. He was impressed at the installation and enjoyed his brief visit this week. A friend stopped by to collect and to restore some antique furniture for the priest guest bedroom. There will be bishops, priests, and deacons visiting us from time to time...and they will be most welcome here at St. Sebastian's.

The wonderful rectory, however, can be like a segment of "*This Old House.*" Some new issues have surfaced that need to be addressed immediately....the first is two leaking bathrooms; one over the kitchen pantry (not too hygienic!) and the other in the basement. A contractor friend and a plumber will open the ceiling and wall to fix them this week. The second is that the rectory only has a wireless, unsecure telephone system. I was speaking to the Auxiliary Bishop and the call was breeched innocently by a staff member. You and I expect calls to the rectory to be confidential and secure. To accomplish this, quotes are being obtained for a simple system our two incoming lines. A new system will be wired and secure to guarantee privacy. The good news is the wiring already is in the house. To address both the plumbing issue and a phone system, we need to pull together. **The Monthly Maintenance Collection on September 4/5 honestly needs to provide for these two most important concerns.** I ask your generous support for this corrective, necessary maintenance and for effective pastoral ministry. I unashamedly ask for a match of my \$100 for these two projects. If anyone wants to talk privately about either issue... please call me. I'm listening!

Finally, have you noticed the days are getting shorter? Enjoy every moment of the waning summer season.
