***THE PASTOR'S CORNER***

One of my favorite novels is The Source by the legendary author, James Michener. The book has over 1000 pages, and is a masterful piece of historical fiction weaving archeology, faith, and the complex issues of the Middle East. I mention it because of today's Gospel from Luke 21. The Wailing Wall is all that is left from the temple project of Herod the Great. Jesus saw, prayed, and lamented the prophetic fall of gold covered Temple. The Romans destroyed it in 70 A.D. The stones that remain in place date back to the time of Jesus. I am seriously considering a parish pilgrimage to the Holy Land within the year in conjunction with projected bible study in the parish.

Jesus predicted the destruction of the Temple as a "sign of the times." As Christians, we are already engaged in this "end time." We live faithful lives now...regardless what others do, what people think, or what people say. We live knowing the One of whom we speak. He is the only foundation of our lives. We have built on solid rock...and, for this, we give thanks.

The wonderful initiatives of the Outreach Committee are to be noted this entire month. Bring a coat for those who are cold, and food or a financial offering for those who are hungry. I am really impressed with the dedication of the parish for these outreach efforts. Please read the bulletin and respond as you were responding to Christ, himself.

Finally, I have to comment briefly on the noteworthy increase in parish support. The Finance Council met recently with diocesan leadership at my invitation. A full parish finance report will be shared with you in a few weeks. My sincere thanks for your increasing generosity to the fiscal health of the parish. We're on the right course...and I thank you.
