**THE PASTOR'S CORNER**

We enter November with two consecutive and related celebrations of the Church: All Saints, for those already in God's presence whether formally proclaimed a Saint by the Church or not; and All Souls, for our beloved dead being purified to one day share in eternal glory.

Walking through Catholic and other cemeteries can enliven within us a sense of the afterlife. One day, someone will be reading our own headstone and wonder, "Who was this person?" The older monuments recorded years, months and days of life. We ask, however, who **is** this person? After all, if we believe that the soul is eternal and partakes in the very life of the God, the tense of the question needs to be adjusted.

Do you remember your faithful departed at Mass, in prayer, at the cemetery? I always find visiting my parents' grave a source of comfort. They were lovingly placed in God's eternal embrace until I see them again. The words of Monica to her priest son, Augustine, are very moving for all priests. She told him that she cared not where they buried her body (either in Ostia, just outside Rome or in her native Africa) as long as he remembered her at the Lord's table. I remember my parents at every Mass I offer as some many of you also do.. The faithful departed are at rest from their labors, and they are at peace.

May we long fast to their loving memory, and pray for the grace to share eternal life with them. So, remember your loved ones, and be thankful.
