THE PASTOR'S CORNER

"Stop, look, listen!" The famous three words that were impressed on me as a boy when crossing the railroad tracks on Bay Street. Occasionally, we'd put pennies on the tracks and go fishing; then, on the way back, we collect our coins that had been flattened by the wheels of the cargo trains.

Come to think of it, these three words contain not only words of safety, but also words of wisdom. Today's Gospel highlights one of the them; listen. "If they do not listen to Moses and the Prophets..." How many times in conversations do we not listen to what is being presented? We hear the words, but they are not registering. Why? Perhaps, we are distracted. Another possibility is that our hearing the words does not connect to the heart.

Settling into a new parish requires listening. requires listening and appreciating the stories of the divergent people who comprise the parish: young/old, men/women, saints/sinners, those who practice the faith/ and those who don't. It takes time...lots of time to listen to the connections within the parish and beyond. Listening and consulting the Parish Trustees, members of the Finance Council, the Pastoral Council, Religious Education, Music and Liturgical Ministry, Parish Outreach...each and every component of parish life provides me with insights of where the parish has been and discerning where we should go as a Catholic community of faith. By necessity, some things will change, some things will be deepened and augmented; and yes, some things will be pruned to ensure new vibrancy and life. But it takes time to listen to such dedicated parishioners as the journey is planned and begun.

You are with me as I journey to Rome. Until we celebrate the Eucharist again, listen to the Spirit speaking to us.
