CANDLEMAS DAY AND ST. BLAISE DAY

The Church commemorates the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple, 40 days after Christmas, on February 2nd. Candles used in Church will be blessed on this day at the 7 am Mass.

The next day, February 3rd is dedicated to the martyr, St. Blaise (+318 AD). The traditional blessing of throats with blessed candles will take place after the 7 am Mass.

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

I'm still overwhelmed, ...and **full!** Over 110 parishioners joined in the Pot Luck Supper to celebrate our patronal feast of St. Sebastian. Many thanks to everyone who in any way assisted with this parish event. I'm left with the question, "Now what do we do as a parish?"

The answer is straightforward; we get an attitude. **Attitude** is the answer. I don't mean a surly, cocky attitude we observe or encounter while driving a car or waiting in line at the market ... but the ones highlighted in the Gospel. Jesus taught them to have a new attitude. His followers are to **BE** the attitudes mentioned in the Sermon on the Mount. It's a mosaic of our presentation of Christian living. Often we hear, "Lose your attitude!" but today we hear to BE an attitude. St. Paul, the greatest preacher of the Christian era, writes to the Church in Philippi, "Your **attitude** must be that of Christ...He emptied Himself to take the form of slave" only to be later exalted (Phil 2: 5-11 *passim*).

The Sermon on the Mount will continue into March. They are highlighted with parables and comparisons..."The Kingdom of God is like..." They grab your attention and are a check on our attitude. Note them, ponder them, and consider them in the ordinariness of Ordinary Time. I believe you will find them most helpful for our attitude adjustment to the challenge of the Gospel.

PARISH FINANCE COUNCIL

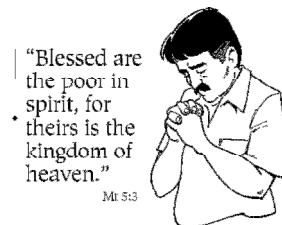
Members of the Finance Council will meet in the rectory on this Monday, January. 31st at 7:00 pm.
