THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Today's readings highlight the 'Fall' of Adam and Eve, and the temptation of Jesus in the desert. The effects of the former are ever present; the challenge of the latter needs further reflection.

The Hebrew writers of Genesis attempted to explain how we got into the human situation in which we find ourselves. The first sin was not simply eating the fruit of the Tree of Knowledge, but of gross pride: "You shall become like gods." The creatures wanted to become the Creator. The result ended in a cosmic 'time-out' for the entire human race. That is, until the time of Jesus. A reversal was needed; and one act of obedience to the Father cancelled debt of disobedience by the man and the woman.

The personification of the devil as a small homely creature, with pointy ears and a pitchfork tail are rather simplistic. The three-fold temptation of Christ is viewed spiritually as our conflict within: the craving for comfort and satisfaction, for commanding power, and for alluring wealth. No; the temptations are much more subtle, but extremely lethal.

Often times when listening to young (and not so young) adults, I hear the echoes of the temptations in this Gospel. When the inevitable pause comes in the conversation, I will offer the comment, "*Just remember one thing: the darkness takes no hostage!*" How many lives have been turned from glory to ashes before our very hearts and eyes.

These 40 Days provide the opportunity to ponder, to pray, and to pursue the offer of a new beginning in Christ. Notice that after Jesus made his decision in the desert, he was not alone. Angels came to minister to him. And that, dear parishioners, is exactly the point. In our Christian lives, we don't "go it alone." We go with our brothers and sisters oftentimes even to the cross. But the story does not simply end there; we continue on to glory in Him.

Make this Lent a time of reflection and quiet. You'll be amazed the miracles that you will encounter.
