THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners, Visiting Family and Friends:

Welcome to St. Sebastian's for the celebration of Holy Week. I invite all of you to join us for this very special week in the Church. The schedule of celebrations is listed on the front cover of this bulletin.

Today, we celebrate the entrance of the Lord into Jerusalem. With our blessed palm branches, we welcome the Messiah as Lord.

As we begin the Sacred Three Days, there is no Morning Mass after Wednesday.

On **Holy Thursday at 7 PM**, the Church celebrates the institution of the priesthood and the Holy Eucharist. The pastor washes the feet of parishioners, a sign of humble service to his parishioners. The procession to the daily chapel is where the Holy Eucharist will be in repose until midnight. Come and spend some quiet time in prayer and adoration.

On **Good Friday**, the most solemn of all days in the Church, we remember the passion and death of the Lord. **Stations of the Cross at 3 PM**, and **Liturgy of the Passion, and the Veneration of the Cross at 7 PM** focus our attention on the cost of our redemption.

The Solemn Vigil of Easter will be celebrated on Holy Saturday Evening at 8 PM. The ceremony is rich with symbols: new fire, the blessing of the Easter candle, renewal of baptismal promises, and the reception of Confirmation for Michele Clarino.

Join us in prayer and celebration during this Holy Week. May you be renewed in faith as we commemorate the events that won our salvation in Christ.

EASTER DUTY OBLIGATION

After they have reached their First Holy Communion, Catholics are bound by the obligation of receiving Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept should be fulfilled during the Easter Season. Catholics are also bound to confess serious (mortal) sins at least once a year, but this is not limited to the Lenten/Easter Season

LENTEN FASTING AND ABSTINENCE REGULATIONS

On Good Friday, Catholics of age 14 and older abstain from meat, and those age 18 to 59 fast, limiting themselves to one full meal and two smaller meals..

ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Just as the disciples stayed with the Lord during his agony on the Mount of Olives before the betrayal by Judas, we will stay with the Lord at the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament Holy Thursday evening until midnight. Please join our prayerful watch over our Lord. Sign up sheets are in the vestibule.. *"Could you not stay with Me one hour..."*

GOOD FRIDAY COLLECTION

On Good Friday, our parish will take up the annual Good Friday Collection for the Holy Land. Your financial contribution helps to support the struggling Christian community and to protect Christianity's holiest places. Please be generous.
