THE PASTOR'S CORNER

We had a wonderful parish mission preached by Fr. Paquette on the theme, "Discipleship." His very genuine and caring meditations touched many of our parishioners and friends who were able to join us this past week. The Monday meditation on Reconciliation is reinforced this evening (Sunday) at 6:30 PM with a Parish Penance Service. You may have seen the extraordinary video clip of Pope Francis break rank as he was being escorted to hear confessions. He wanted to go to confession first, and he did so to one of the priests awaiting penitents. I can't imagine the thoughts running through that priest's mind and heart as he sees Pope Francis heading towards HIM for confession. I would be looking around for the smelling salts!

Today's Gospel of the Raising of Lazarus (Jn. 11:1-45) is the last of the "signs" in John's Gospel. The dramatic raising of the dead was the last straw for the authorities; this man needs to be silenced. "So from that time on they planned to kill him." (vs. 53). I have always been struck by the words of Jesus immediately after Lazarus emerges from the tomb of death. It is spoken to the crowds who came to mourn with Mary and Martha over the death of their brother. The text reads, "And Jesus said to them (i.e. the crowd), 'Untie him, let him go."

If you decide to join us this evening (and I pray you do), you WILL be set free...I promise you, you will! Whether it has been days, weeks, months, or years...even decades, all I can do is sincerely reassure you is that you *WILL* go home with new life as did Lazarus. The Pope recently commented that "the Confessional is not a court of condemnation, but the experience of forgiveness and mercy!" The priests joining me are not judges, but men of deep faith and humility. We will welcome and guide you. Trust yourself; return to the Sacraments (Penance and the Eucharist).

Be sure to take home a bulletin with the Holy Week Schedule. Plan to join us for the great days of our salvation in Christ. It's a great time of year to be a happy and renewed Catholic!
