**THE PASTOR'S CORNER**

What a difference a year makes! I departed for the Holy Land on August 15<sup>th</sup> last year. I would not be going this year with the continuing unrest in the Middle East. Reviewing my photos and the blog brings it all back again. Sometimes it is the subtle things you remember.

Subtlety is art of distinction whether in relationships, the fine arts, or Scripture. Looking at a Rembrandt, with his exquisite use of light refraction, is artistic subtlety. You need to take time to be absorbed into the proposed subtlety in order to "see" with the eyes (and heart) of the Master.

The Hebrew Scripture (1 Kings) today is all about subtlety. The God is Israel was not in the mighty wind, nor the earthquake, nor the fire. He was in a whisper; a gentle whisper that Elijah heard on Mt. Horeb (a.k.a. Mt. Sinai).

St. Paul felt deep tremendous anguish when his own Jewish people, who had "the adoption, the glory, the covenants, the giving of the law, the worship, and the promises" could not recognize Jesus as Messiah. The subtlety of salvation history freely offered in Christ was not claimed.

If there is one thing that the Lord has shown me as a pastor, it is the subtlety of His presence and action in the lives of His people. I'm amazed how the Lord moves them toward grace (His love); how He shows them the need for a change of heart; and how He leads them to believe in His unconditional love without exception. Whether listening to parishioners, younger priests, or anonymous penitents, *their* attraction and response to Jesus is humbling. The change is in some cases life-changing, as it is for Peter in today's Gospel. We need to learn to keep our eyes fixed on Jesus. When our faith vision gets out of focus, the unrest begins and our inner tranquility unravels. It's all about subtlety especially in the spiritual life. Remember that we pray in the Creed, "*things visible and invisible.*" See, and believe!

Stay focused, acknowledge the subtlety, and live always in the Lord.

Summer is waning: enjoy it!!
