***THE PASTOR'S CORNER***

The Solemnity of the Assumption this Thursday is a holy day for the Catholic Church. The dogma on the Assumption of Mary proclaimed by Pope Pius XII in 1950 reads: "*we pronounce, declare, and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma: that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory.*" The Church prays that where Mary has gone, we hope to follow. I purposely leave on Assumption Day and dedicate this journey to Mary's loving and protective care. My hope is to celebrate the first sabbatical Mass at Benedictine *Einsiedeln Abbey* (see photo) before the 'Black Madonna of Switzerland'. St. Meinrad founded the abbey in 835 A.D. It's a center for Marian devotion.



This last verse of today's Responsorial Psalm sets the theme for my sabbatical departure on the holy day. "*May your kindness, O LORD, be upon us who have put our hope in you.*" Although there is always the "threat" of danger anywhere in the Middle East, I promise to be prudent and alert. I leave you in very good pastoral hands. Enjoy the pastoral ministry of Frs. Paquette, Willenberg, Hayman, Rodrigues, Ricard and Mahar!! ...and tell them you appreciate their presence!

St. Paul lovingly admonished his most endeared followers to be faithful "especially now that I am absent..." (Phil 2: 12)." I can only offer the same pastoral guidance to all of you. We are united daily in prayer especially at the Holy Eucharist. Pray for peace in Jerusalem and throughout the Middle East. I look forward to seeing you on Thanksgiving Day. Until then, pray and strive for holiness.
