#### MY DEAR PARISHIONERS,

The unknown artist of the Icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help portrayed the anguish of Jesus as Jesus contemplated the vision of His future Passion which is represented by the instruments of His coming death. Archangel Gabriel holds the cross and Archangel Michael holds the spear. These elements show the reality of the suffering and Passion of Christ. At the same time the Picture gives evidence of the triumph of Christ over suffering and death. The artist depicts the triumph by painting the background of the Icon in gold. Gold is a sign of the Also the artist paints the angels Resurrection. holding the instruments of the Passion in a triumphant manner. The instruments no longer appear as threats of destruction, but rather TROPHIES of victory. These trophies were taken from Calvary on Easter Sunday morning.

It can be said that the main theme of the Icon of *Our Lady of Perpetual Help* is the mystery of the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Christ. The focal point of the Icon is to be found in the clasping of the hands of the Mother and the Child. The right hand of the Mother welcomes the Son, thus stressing the humanity of Christ. The reality of the Incarnation can be seen in the gesture of the Child showing the sole of His foot and clinging to His Mother, seeking the comfort of Mary.

The hand of the Virgin Mary indicates at the same time the divinity of Jesus. Mary's hand gently guides us to her Son, our Redeemer, to Jesus who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. And Mary is our Perpetual Help, who intercedes for us with her Son, who sacrificed His life for us on the Cross of Calvary. The star on the forehead of Our Lady accentuates the role which Mary has in the plan of salvation: to be *Mother of God* and Mother of all humanity.

As we contemplate the Icon of *Our Lady of Perpetual Help*, we can grasp the sense of the Mystery of Christ and deepen our relationship with Jesus under the guidance of the Mother of the Redeemer.

Our parish will the Novena prayers to *Our Lady of Perpetual Help* every Tuesday morning following the 7:00 am Mass.
