THE PASTOR'S CORNER

This text from Hebrews 12:2, while not read this weekend, does summarize our Christian vocation. In today's Gospel, Peter asks boldly, "***IF*** it is you, command me to come to you on the water." *Notice that when he took his eyes off Jesus, Peter began to sink.* Peter faltered because he was not focused on the goal, namely, going to Jesus even on a stormy sea.

Josh Groban dedicated to the victims of 9-11 the hit single "*You Raise Me Up*." The lyrics of this popular song include: "You raise me up, to walk on stormy seas..." It's the gentle question of Jesus to Peter that is poignant for all of us. "*O you of little faith, why did you doubt?*" Why do I; why do you?

Elijah, a great prophet in Israel, had his own surprise from God. The prophet expected a great theophany in wind and earthquake. It was not to be. The Divine Presence came to Elijah in a small whispering sound. Listen for Him... try to be still.... for God speaks loudest within the silence.

This past Wednesday was my 32nd anniversary of receiving the grace of priestly ordination. Trust me when I tell you that the Lord has spoken VERY CLEARLY many times over these three decades. Surprises, questions, doubts, laughter, tears, embraces, love and joy all kneaded into a priestly vocation. Now my eyes are fixed on Jesus in parish life....thanks to all of you.

Enjoy these fleeing weeks of summer. It's great to see some parishioners returning home to us.

“SIX REASONS FOR THE NEW TRANSLATION”

Professor Anthony Esolen penned these comments in *Magnificat: Roman Missal Companion*.

“First, the passages may differ significantly from what we have become accustomed to: for example, the response of the people to the elevation of the host, “Lord I am not worthy that you should come under my roof.”

Second, they may restore words that have been omitted or removed from their right place, as in the great sequence of verbs that begin the Gloria: “we praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you.”

Third, that may translate more accurately and with greater attention to poetic specificity what had been left general and vague, as when the priest says that Jesus raised the chalice filled with “the fruit of the vine,” or then, at the beginning of every Preface, the priest says that we give God thanks is “our duty and our salvation.”

Fourth, they may respond more clearly with the language of Holy Scripture, as when in the third Eucharistic Prayer the priest says that God wishes to gather a people to himself “from the rising of the sun to its setting.”

Fifth, that may revise an inaccuracy, as when, in the Creed, we replace the misleading phrase “seen and unseen,” which suggests that we are considering things that some people see or happen not to see, with the precise, “visible and invisible,” which affirms that God is the creator of things that are possible and impossible to be seen.

Sixth, that may raise the register of our prayer beyond the drab and the workaday to the sacral, as when we affirm that God does not merely “give” us good things, but “bestows” them upon all the world.”
