

*THE PASTOR'S CORNER*

The Christmas season can at times appear to be chronologically erratic. We are still within the Octave of Christmas, yet now we find the child twelve years old with Mary and Joseph looking frantically for him in Jerusalem. These are most sobering thoughts during this season of Christmas trees, festive lights, and angelic messages. My prayer is that we ever cherish our children and assist them as they "advance in wisdom, age, and favor before God."

St. John wrote some amazing reflections that are used during this holy octave. My favorite is what was read the second day after Christmas, "*What was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we looked upon and touched with our hands concerns the Word of Life... (which) we proclaim now to you*" (1 John 1:1-3 *passim*). Is there anything more precious for us than to know that we have received what the Apostle John himself found and experienced with Jesus, the Christ?

The search of Mary and Joseph for Jesus is symbolic of our own search for Him. Many desired to find the child in the Christmas story. Herod searched for the child, but only to kill Him. Shepherds and Magi found him because they sought Him with humility and awe. The three Magi will arrive at our outdoor Christmas crèche this week. So, now it's our turn to seek and to find him in our families. A family provides two things to their children: *roots and wings!* Roots, so that they know they are loved; and wings, so that their children go out into the world confident in faith that God is always their companion. These are two great gifts at Christmas for all the children of God.

## HOLY LAND PILGRIMAGE 2014

Monsignor Darcy will be leading a 10 day Pilgrimage to the Holy Land October 20-30, 2014. Reservations are limited to 38 pilgrims, 22 have already reserved a place for the 4 nights in Jerusalem and 4 nights at the Sea of Galilee. *Participants must be really capable of sustained walking up/down hills and streets, on cobblestones, and possible distances.* Final cost is determined by airfares ... **present estimated price is \$3,495 pp** (double occupancy with private bath) and includes transportation to airport, flights, portage of one suitcase per person, breakfast and dinner daily. Call the rectory to receive the *Preliminary Flyer* (prepared before his sabbatical, but will be updated.)
