### The Pastor's Corner

This first part of Advent has the appearance of John the Baptist, also known as the Precursor in the Orthodox tradition. John literally points the way to Christ in iconography; his message is well known. John the Baptist quotes the prophet Isaiah. Israel awaits the day when they can return to the Holy City from the throes of exile. They long for a smooth return symbolized by the road being made straight and pot holes filled in...no valleys, no detours, a graced return to the Holy City, Jerusalem. Attending Handel's Messiah last Sunday, I heard the tenor begin the Sacred Oratorio by singing the words of today's Gospel. This musical masterpiece has inaugurated for me the spirit of this holy season. Advent is such a beautiful liturgical season of sound, May we respond to its gentle sight, and solitude. invitation!
