THE PASTOR'S CORNER

The Annual Potluck Supper celebrating St. Sebastian Day was quite the success in our newly painted hall. About 85 parishioners and friends joined in the festivities. Jaime, our part-time maintenance man is doing a fantastic job finishing painting the hall, and David, of course, did a great job in preparing for the event. Our next parish event will be St. Patrick's Day on Saturday, March 21st!! Mark your calendars for traditional Irish fare with music once again provided by *Jesse Jack'Son*. Save the date!

Speaking of marks, I began noticing marks on the Reconciliation Room ceiling a few weeks ago. They have increased and lengthened. I feared the worse, and I was correct...water infiltration from the bell tower. Max Girouard from the Diocesan Building Commission visited, and we invited a building/ masonry contractor to a follow-up exploratory meeting. The engineer from the 2003 renovation project will be consulted as the next step in this exploratory phase. There definitely is upper level deterioration on the bell tower walls that permits moisture to down the entire length of the structure. What that means is unclear at this point. I will keep the parish aware of the situation, as more information is available. Masonry work will be needed to seal eroded mortar joints and replace some of the deteriorating limestone frieze on the exterior of the Church in the spring.

The Gospel today sounds like a re-run from last week. Then, we heard St. John's version; today we hear the call of the first Apostles in the Gospel of St. Mark. The difference is what the call requires; it needs our response...now. The time to respond to the invitation to "Come and Follow," is now.

Jonah told his fellow citizens of Nineveh (near Mosul, Iraq) to reform and repent, *now*; and they did. It seems to me that if there's one thing needed in today's world it's reform and repentance. By the way, Lent begins on February 18th. And, there's only 54 days till Spring!!
