THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Worrying is a major part of our ordinary Christian lives. We worry about employment; about the kid's getting (and staying) in college, about our health, about our retirement, and about our "final days." It's fascinating how we torture ourselves; many times needlessly!

In today's final selection from the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus uses the word "**worry**" four times...and some of them related to things in the first paragraph. How many of us (me included) worry about things that have never come to pass! So, why did we worry? Basically, it is a form of unbelief.

If you re-read the Gospel carefully, Matthew uses the biblical argument "from lesser to greater." Its key phrase is: "How much more..." Indeed, how much more do we need to grow in faith? The genuine answer is: "A lot!"

The Church Year provides the opportunity to move from lesser to greater...it is called Lent. We desire to be better Christians as we move from Ash Wednesday to Easter. Lent begins with a day of fast and abstinence for the Christian faithful. These forty days prepare us for the holiest night of the year, the Easter Vigil, which we will celebrate on April 19th

As highlighted elsewhere in today's bulletin, the Lenten schedule includes: Morning Mass at 7:00 am, Stations of the Cross, the Rice Bowl Program, the Parish Mission, support of Fr. Luke and the troops in Afghanistan, our weekly food collection, the Sandwich Program of the Parish Outreach Committee, the weekly opportunity for Confession, daily prayer, and our private works of charity; all of which help us intensify our spiritual life during this penitential season. I'll have more suggestions for you next week, but there is something here for all of us.

Fr. Ernie will be with us at the 7 am Mass on Ash Wednesday! He's home for a visit with family and friends. We welcome him warmly (he's serving on the tropical Caribbean island of Nevis!). Lent is Old English for springtime! If Lent is here, spring is only a month away. Now that, too, is something really to celebrate!

DAYS OF FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Weekdays of Lent:

There is no obligation to fast. However, voluntary acts of self-denial are recommended.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday

These are days of **FAST and ABSTINENCE from meat**. There is a limit of one full meal on these days for all between the ages of 18-59 inclusive.

Days of Abstinence (All Fridays in Lent) All who have reached their 14th year are bound to abstain totally from meat.
