A Prayer for the Dear Departed

Even though I walk in the dark valley
 I fear no evil: for you are at my side...Psalm 23:4

The custom of praying for the faithful departed can be traced back to the early days of Christianity when believers used to post the names of their deceased loved ones in their churches. By the 6th century, religious monasteries were praying for their deceased members on a specific day. Finally, this feast was instituted for the entire Church as a day for all of us to pray for those who have already passed into eternity.

Such a feast is consoling - especially if we are grieving the death of a loved one. Trusting that they are being held in the arms of a loving God, we pray for our deceased to help them on their journey to heaven. We thank God for their goodness, their struggles, their example. This day also reminds us of our own death when we will be reunited with them. There are a variety of options for today's readings. But all make one thing clear: God is with us in both time and eternity - and during the transition we know as death.

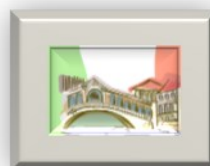
