## THE PASTOR'S CORNER

This weekend is solemn one for the entire nation as we commemorate the loss of nearly 3,000 Americans killed during the terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001. Similar to the assassination of President John Kennedy, we all remember where we were and what we were doing when the towers were struck and collapsed that sunny Tuesday morning. Our world has changed since those very tense days. Two wars are ongoing, lives have been sacrificed, and families continue to mourn. It is a solemn day, and *we as a nation must always remember...and pray for justice and peace.*

The Mass readings today are most appropriate as a backdrop for this weekend. The grace of healing always takes time. Whether the hurt be within our personal lives, our families, our Church, our nation...we need time to heal. As long as the anger festers and consumes us, we have no internal harmony or peace. The Wisdom Tradition of Sirach and the Gospel from Matthew are today's hinges for a reflection on genuine Christian forgiveness. Why do we hug tightly to wrath, and anger if "they are hurtful things?" (Sirach 27:30). The simple theological answer is because of sin. Sin inserts a wedge between us and God, between neighbor and self. Sin, the result of our fall from grace, is an enemy of God. If we fail to forgive the faults and failures of others, the consequences are disastrous in terms of our relationship with God. As generous or as stingy as we are to others with the gift of forgiveness, the same measure will be mirrored back to us. I know I have to work on this in my own priestly life. Perhaps you do, too.

St. Paul reminds us that in the end "faith, hope and love, these three remain; but the greatest of these is love" (1 Cor. 13:13). Easy to say, difficult to perfect without the example and witness of Christ, Himself.

May you be at peace this week.
