Pastor's Corner

Today's Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Body of Christ, centers on the gift of the Most Holy Eucharist, the center of our Catholic faith. The Risen Christ is really present to us in the Eucharist. It is His parting gift to his Apostles and disciples.

We should never approach the Lord unworthily, that is, conscious of serious sin in our lives. If we are, we need to be reconciled in Confession, be absolved, and only then return to the Eucharist. As I preached last weekend, we need be very concerned about becoming "too familiar" even when approaching the Eucharist. Presumption (taking God's mercy for granted) can thus easily lead to sacrilege. St. Thomas Aquinas opines that the worst sacrilege is committed by those who deliberately receive Communion unworthily. (*Summa Theologica*, Secunda Secundæ Partis, Article 3 at #99). Yes, God is merciful with all us sinners; but also just. The summer is coming... get right with God...be reconciled in Confession and then receive the Eucharist.

On a transitional note, the parish choir concludes its ministry this weekend. "It is right and just" that we offer our thanks to Bill Cooper, the choir, Marie Brito, and Lori Maciel for their very diligent service to the parish in music ministry. I hope more parishioners will consider making a commitment and join the choir in the fall. Choir, Outreach, Religious Education, liturgical ministries, and parish activities don't just "happen." They're the result of our involved, interested, and committed parishioners making a difference in this great parish on the East Side. We'll have a whole conversation of committed and volunteerism in the very near future.

Finally, so many of our young adults have concluded their collegiate studies. Some will enter graduate school; others will land their first post-college job. To all the 2012 graduates, the parish sends you of very best wishes and prayerful support at this accomplishment in your life. Thanks, too, to your parents, who sacrificed to make your degree a reality. The world awaits you! Stay close to your faith, your families, and get out there and make a difference.
