#### PASTOR'S CORNER

“Are you smarter than a Fifth Grader?” In terms of our Catholic faith, let me present the following question: After Easter, what is the most important celebration in the Church calendar?

- A - Christmas Day
- B -The Death of John the Baptist
- C - Pentecost
- D -The Annunciation

The correct answer is C, today's celebration of Pentecost. As the so-called birthday of the Church, the Spirit empowered and emboldened the Apostles to proclaim the Resurrection. Today, some **1 billion people**, yes, that's billion, profess their faith in the Catholic Church established by Christ. That's still 100 million more than *Face Book!*

What was Pentecost? The Jews celebrated it as a harvest festival celebrated 50 days after Passover. For the Christians, it commemorates the outpouring of the Spirit on the Apostles and Mary ten days after the return of the Lord to glory. The Acts of the Apostles highlights that numinous event. Fired-up (as it were) with the very Spirit of Jesus, they broke out of their timidity and proclaimed their faith in the Risen Christ. They literally died for that faith. Today? Well, draw your own conclusion. It would seem that for many, their faith is perhaps at best, an *acceptable* inconvenience.

We get fired-up about contemporary, political, financial issues...and rightly so. Do we bring that same level passion over into our lives as members of the Church and when we gather at Mass? Have we ever listened to intensity of the responses at Mass or the singing of our praise to God? I very respectfully invite you to do so. Would our level of excitement (mine and yours) make others want to join us as a people of faith?

*“Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit, and they shall be created, and You shall renew the face of the earth. Amen! Alleluia!”*
