PASTOR'S CORNER

As we approach the end of the Church liturgical year, the theme centers on the final coming of Christ. *"Stay awake, you know neither the day nor the hour"* (today's Gospel). Next week, "Come, share in the joy of your Master." This month of All Souls highlights the fact that the Lord will call of us to Himself. No one but Lazarus can tell us what that experience is like. We remember our loved ones who preceded us and also await the Resurrection. May they rest in peace.

Today's second reading has much to say to us about our approach to the final things. We do not grieve like those who have no hope (1 Thess. 4:13). Our loved ones have returned to God, who did first give them to us. When you look at a gravestone, we see the name of a person and usually their year of birth and their year of death. Between the two dates is a dash (-). It represents everything the person did during the years he/she lived. Our lives will be reduced to a simple dash. All that we've accomplished in our lifetime is contained in that one dash on a stone. What have you and I done...for God, for the Church, for our family, for our parish, for our community, for our nation?

Speaking of the nation, Fr. Ernie, a retired US Air Force Chaplain, will offer **Mass at 9:00 am next Friday, November 11th on Veterans' Day**. I will be attending the annual meeting of the Order of Malta in NYC. He will bless the new American flag and raise it on the refurbished flagpole. We honor the men and women who currently serve in the Armed Forces. May they be protected from all harm and return safely to their families.

I will give a catechesis on the new translation of the Roman Missal this weekend and next. We'll review the responses of the congregation, as well as their biblical/theological significance. The pew cards will be in the book racks for at least the next six months. You'll notice the changes in red on the cards. No doubt there will be some tongue twisting moments for all of us!
